The purpose is to improve learning levels, academic performance, awareness, exposure, confidence, capabilities and employability of students and youth in rural India.

2. PROGRAM UPDATES 2021-22:

As in previous years, in 2021-22 IN-DEED continued to organise and facilitate live classes and extra classes, conducted online assessments, provided access to explanatory audio-visual content on curriculum subjects, all the while promoting digital empowerment and 21st century skills training for beneficiary students.

2.1 PLATFORM ED-TECH SOLUTION

An all-inclusive software solution **PLATform** (*Personalised Learning, Assessment and Training*) was developed for provision of quality education.

Through advancED **PLATform** solution we were able to deliver:

- Live and online classes
- Physical and online assessments
- Provide access to explanatory AV content on curriculum subjects
- Digital empowerment and 21st century skills training




2.2 GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION & COVERAGE

The program was implemented in 38 rural and urban schools in Jodhpur and Pali districts of Rajasthan. The schools were shortlisted after due consultation with and upon the recommendation of District Education Officers of both districts.

4,200 students from 38 government schools were covered under the project. Academic session 2021-22 was once again a truncated one, with repeated school closures during 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} waves of coronavirus pandemic in March-April 2021 and January-February 2022. This, in effect, reduced by half the effective time for implementation of interventions.

3.1 CHALLENGES - CORONAVIRUS ENFORCED LOCKDOWNS

The second and third waves of coronavirus in early 2021 and 2022 forced schools to remain shut from March to August 2021 and once again closed for a few weeks in early 2022. In effect, during academic session 2021-22, schools were open for only half the session resulting in a lot of challenges in implementing the program.

3.2 MEETINGS WITH STAKEHOLDERS

In April-May 2021, IN-DEED Foundation maintained regular contact with District Education Officials and government school principals and teachers. Starting June, when offices and schools opened (*for teachers only*), work on identifying and shortlisting of schools in both districts was started. Meetings were conducted with school leaders and DEOs to bring them onboard and commence program activities in schools.

3.3 BASELINE SURVEY

Baseline survey of student performance, particularly class X board result of 2019 was compiled from shortlisted schools. 2019 has been used as the base year for comparison of current (2022) board exams results since exams in 2020 and 2021 were based on internal school tests. In the shadow of covid, the results were such that overall pass percentage was highly inflated compared to any year before coronavirus hit India in 2020.

3.4 PLATFORM SOFTWARE DEVELOPMENT


The PLATform software was developed by IN-DEED Foundation for facilitating online classes, assessments and training programs in selected schools. After successful field trials in August 2021, PLATform was successfully deployed for classes and assessments in schools starting September 2021, when schools finally reopened. The creation and development of AdvanceD Software Solution PLATform will be over time be used to reach hundreds of thousands of students. It will certainly be a long-term asset for all stakeholders in the education sector working for underprivileged school students.

3.5 ONLINE CLASSES & ASSESSMENTS

IN-DEED Foundation partnered with ConceptLive for providing free Live and Online classes in Hindi. Assessment Questionnaires in multiple choice question format were prepared by volunteers in both English and Hindi for classed VI-XII. Training sessions on Digital Empowerment, Career Counselling, Psychometric Assessment, Financial Literacy, Motivation, Coding, Robotics, STEM Learning, Yoga etc.

3.6. PARTNERSHIP WITH BYJUS

In its continuous effort towards empowering children from underserved backgrounds with quality education and digital learning opportunities, IN-DEED Foundation partnered with BYJU's, India's leading Ed-tech company. Under the Education for All initiative of BYJUs, access to individual learning licences were provided to beneficiary school students at no cost. This enabled students to learn from the country's best teachers, accessing high quality audio-video curriculum content to clear doubts, master concepts and perform well in academics.




Chart – Student performance in 2022 versus 2019 – Rajasthan board class X examination results

4.3. PROJECT OUTCOMES

The actual number of beneficiaries impacted is higher than the number targeted, despite the fact that the severity of second wave of covid-19 pandemic in March-April 2021 forced schools to remain closed till September 2021.

Then in January 2022, the third wave reared its ugly head and schools were forced to close down again for a few weeks. In effect, the session was hugely truncated with effective project implementation time reduced to less than half of the academic session.

Following have been the significant outcomes of the program:

- ➤ Development of AdvancED Software Solution PLATform (Personalised Learning, Assessment and Training)
- > Students from target schools were able to access live classes, participate in assessments and training programs
- ➤ 4,199 students from 38 schools benefitted through the program
- ➤ Improvement in academic performance at individual and school level
- Digital empowerment of beneficiary students
- > Students from over 40 villages and low-income communities studying in the selected schools benefitted from the program
- Overall 90%+ positive response to programs from stakeholders observed



5. SUSTAINABILITY:

5.1 PLATFORM SOFTWARE

The development of AdvancED Software solution PLATform will help immensely in taking quality education to government school and rural students.

IN-DEED Foundation shall be using the PLATform software for conducting classes, assessments and training programs so that underserved students can learn from the best teachers and trainers in the country.

Further, assessments on smart devices - tablets in schools and individual smartphones at home - allow increased participation due to the ease of taking tests making students eagerness to sit for regular tests. With assessment results being instantly available, students able to view their mistakes and compare test scores with their classmates, it is sure to become a useful and valuable tool in improved academic performance of the beneficiaries.

Overall, the freely available PLATform software and app will help engage students in a meaningful way with significant long-term potential in provision of quality education to large number of students. PLATform App is under development.

5.2 MOU WITH RAJASTHAN COUNCIL OF SCHOOL EDUCATION

In order to scale-up programs and positively impact thousands of students, IN-DEED Foundation made a presentation before the Director, Rajasthan Council of School Education on 7^{th} June 2022, under the Rajasthan Education Initiative of the state government.

Signing of MoU for partnership between Rajasthan government and IN-DEED Foundation is in the final stages. Under the aegis of this partnership, IN-DEED shall conduct quality education programs in all schools of 4 districts, viz. Pali, Jodhpur, Barmer and Jaisalmer. Further, in-depth programs will be taken up in 100+ model schools (English medium Vivekananda and Mahatma Gandhi schools set up by Rajasthan State Government for underprivileged students) in these four districts.

5.3 CSR PARTNERSHIPS

IN-DEED Foundation has partnered with BYJUs to provide free access to their curriculum content under their Education For All initiative. The plan is to cover 1 lakh students providing them BYJUs content for a period of 3 years.

To raise resources to reach out to 1,00,000+ students by 2025, IN-DEED is hoping to receive continued backing and support from CSR partners.








